Programs

Professional Development Conference *October 19-22, 2017*

Juniors, seniors and graduate students have the opportunity to apply for this premier professional development program. Only 200 students are accepted and it only costs \$50 to attend. Through intense workshops, excellent networking opportunities, and 1-on-1 coaching, you will leave feeling prepared to tackle your post-collegiate career.

Regional Officer Training *January 13, 20, 27 and February 3, 2018*

The Regional Officer Trainings (ROT) are a series of regional leadership training programs hosted by Fraternity staff and volunteers in January and February. The ROTs are one-day programs where students and advisors of a number of local chapters meet at a central location and learn the basics of their position, gain useful strategies to maximize their impact, and network with other Phi Psis in their region. The ROTs are our largest in-person set of programs, reaching upwards of 1000 students and advisors each year. More information on the specific location and weekend your chapter will be expected to attend will be available soon via email.

Grand Arch Council *July 11 - 15, 2018*

The Grand Arch Council will take place in Las Vegas, Nevada at the Red Rock Resort. Each chapter is required to have undergraduate representation at the Grand Arch Council, so it is important that your chapter plan accordingly.

- Each chapter is pre-registered for two undergraduate members to attend as long as they are registered by June 4, 2018. After June 4, a chapter must pay an extra \$100 registration fee per person to use their pre-registration.
- Each chapter is required to cover transportation and hotel costs for those members who will attend. The hotel room rate will be \$169 per night (plus tax). A chapter should budget \$800 per hotel room. The chapter may choose to contact another chapter in order to split a hotel room.
- Red Rock Resort requires the person checking into the hotel room to be 21 years of age or older. Please plan accordingly.

GreekLifeEdu

GreekLifeEdu is an online program which addresses the critical issues of alcohol awareness, sexual assault and hazing for incoming fraternity and sorority members. ALL new members who pledge prior to May 1, 2018 and are considered a new member, undergraduate member or alumni as of June 30, 2018 are required to complete GreekLifeEdu. It is recommended the chapter require new members to complete GreekLifeEdu prior to the Induction ceremony. New members who depledge prior to the induction ceremony will not be counted.

Pledge Fee

Reporting new members is required WITHIN 7 DAYS of completing the formal pledge ceremony. Failure to register new members in the Officer Portal within 7 days of completion of the Pledge Ceremony will result in a 10% late fine.

Initiation Fee

Reporting initiation is required WITHIN 7 DAYS of completing the induction ceremony. Failure to report the initiation of members in the Officer Portal within 7 days of completion of the Induction Ceremony will result in a 10% late fine.
