# THE CREED OF PHI KAPPA PSI





# **OUR BROTHERS**

For 129 years, Phi Kappa Psi has set the standard for Greek life at West Virginia University. West Virginia Alpha has been dominant, leading the way in academics, athletics, community service, student involvement and leadership. Today, the tradition of excellence continues.

## **CHAPTER HIGHLIGHTS**

- 113 active brothers making West Virginia Alpha one of the largest fraternities on campus. Recently, 33 new members were recruited, including five legacies.
- **Chapter GPA of 3.3**, being a top performer amongst IFC fraternities and above the all-male undergraduate average.

- Host and volunteer at various community service events to benefit the West Virginia University Children's Hospital.
- Recipient of the 2022 IFC Arista Award of Distinction and the 2023 IFC Interfraternalism Award from the West Virginia University Office of Fraternity & Sorority Life.
- Brother Payne Blankenship was named the 2023 IFC Greek
   Man of the Year.





# **OUR CHALLENGES**

The following factors require a plan so West Virginia Alpha can continue to lead WVU's Greek community and provide for future brothers as it has for so many alumni. The West Virginia Alpha House Corporation assembled a committee to take stock of our chapter's current condition from a housing, scholarship and leadership development perspective with an eye towards University expectations. This group, in conjunction with professional counsel, identified opportunities deemed essential to position West Virginia Alpha for success and excellence.

### **CHAPTER HOUSE CONSERVATION**

We must maintain our home while making it an attractive place to live and to learn.

The age of our chapter house is requiring the House Corporation to invest more significantly in facility upkeep to compete with dramatically improved student living options throughout Morgantown.

#### RISING COST OF HIGHER EDUCATION

We must make West Virginia Alpha affordable while giving our members an advantage in life after college.

Students and their families are increasingly challenged to afford college, leaving the fraternity experience to look like a luxury in view of growing student loan debt.

### **GROWING EXPECTATIONS OF FRATERNITIES**

We must be responsive to change on campus and be leaders within the Greek community.

West Virginia University, like all universities, is placing higher and higher demands on fraternities and the experiences we provide in developing leaders.

# **OUR VISION**

129 years in Morgantown has taught us that maintaining a great chapter requires a combination of a great facility, well-rounded undergraduate men, and capable and committed alumni. The needs of the chapter house and the chapter brothers change over time, and oftentimes from year to year. Being nimble in response to these changing needs is ever more important. Providing our volunteer alumni leadership with the resources to respond to those changing needs is imperative to the future of West Virginia Alpha.





# **OUR CAMPAIGN**

West Virginia Alpha is launching the *Live Ever. Die Never. A Stronger Tomorrow* campaign with the goal to be the most well-resourced chapter at WVU and within the Phi Psi nation. We will do this by leveraging today's tax law and best strategies while ensuring that this campaign serves our needs for decades.

The chapter has long been committed to sustaining excellence through the consistent investment of time and resources from our strong alumni base. We have managed to build and maintain an amazing chapter house and chapel that serves as the physical symbol of brotherhood for so many of us. We have also set aside respectably sized funds to assist in scholarship efforts; a resource that has served us well through the years. However, we require additional, more creative, funding. As we look to the future, the West Virginia Alpha House Corporation is embarking on a comprehensive \$2,250,000 fundraising campaign that will transform and secure our future in the following areas:

# **CHAPTER EDUCATION FUND** (AKA the OneFund) \$1,250,000

This endowed fund will provide a significant annual revenue stream to the House Corporation which, in turn, will be in a position to deploy those resources to maintain the facility while also reducing the cost of education for the undergraduate members of West Virginia Alpha.

## **CHAPTER HOUSE FUND**

\$1,000,000

These temporary funds will be invested in the chapter house and chapel in the near future to address projects that are pressing. These renovations will bring our house into a more competitive position with the university and other off-campus housing.

To achieve success, we will need more of our alumni to give, and more to give generously. Our goals are ambitious, but given our reputation, our tradition, and our commitment to excellence, we expect nothing less than success.


To receive and preserve capital, the Phi Kappa Psi Foundation will assist in the development of these funds and will maintain permanently restricted assets on behalf of the West Virginia Alpha Chapter as it does for chapters throughout the United States.

# MAKE THE CHAPTER HOUSE RELEVANT AND COMPETITIVE

Our chapter house is the body and ultimate symbol of our West Virginia Alpha chapter. It was well-built and structurally, with a few exceptions, it is sound and ready for the future. However, there is a lot inside and outside the house that requires a significant investment totaling \$1,000,000. This campaign will enable the House Corporation to make necessary improvements to the facility that will keep the house as an attractive and competitive place to live as well as a chapter house we can all find a deep pride in sustaining.

The exterior of the house will receive new landscaping, a new privacy fence, a repaired and improved roof, and a code-compliant railing for the staircase. Similarly, the Goose House will receive a new roof and upgraded landscaping. We will also make changes to certain access points to ensure we remain ADA compliant and accessible to all people. We will also install a modern security system that does not intrude on the privacy of our brothers or the activity in the house but will ensure that important exterior access points are monitored and the Chapel is secure.

The interior of the house will receive a lot of attention. Among the priorities are a new and efficient HVAC system, a stable and competitive wireless infrastructure that allows all brothers to access their online classes fluidly and can scale up to meet future demands, and new bathrooms throughout the house.



# BASEMENT LEVEL

The basement level is where a lot of the action happens at West Virginia Alpha. From dining to socializing to washing cloths, the basement is a hub of activity. We will install new flooring to replace the dilapidated and currently separating flooring, renovate the laundry rooms and upgrade the appliances to high grade industrial units that are serviceable. We will also refresh the Womens Lounge and the restroom. Lastly, we will replace aged hot water heaters and ensure the plumbing in the Mechanical Room is sound.




# **MAIN FLOOR**

The Chapel will receive a long-overdue refresh with new paint, a new runner for the floor and an upgrade in the archival presentation of our chapter's history. In particular, it will feature prominent West Virginia Alphans not just from our founding era, but from our more recent eras as well.

The Main Floor houses 11 brothers and our House Manager, but it primarily serves as the first impression to those entering our chapter house. The bathrooms will be fully renovated and the entire floor will be refreshed with new paint and lighting fixtures.


The Library and Living Room will receive the most attention and will be brought up to West Virginia Alpha standards with new fraternity-grade furnishings, a donor wall that celebrates all those that have made generous gifts to support and sustain West Virginia Alpha. In addition, we will ensure that our proud history is put on display so guests and future brothers will be able to understand the impact that Phi Kappa Psi has had on its members and the community of Morgantown for decades.





# SECOND FLOOR

Our second floor is our largest residential floor, holding 22 brothers. It also receives a lot of guest traffic throughout each year. We will renovate the bathrooms, repaint the hallway and rooms, and upgrade the technology infrastructure so each brother can access his classes remotely when needed and be connected to the world beyond Morgantown.



# THIRD FLOOR

The third floor houses 11 brothers. This level will also receive new paint, renovated bathrooms and upgrade wireless technology.

# MAKE THE BROTHERHOOD STRONGER

Historically, chapter operations are sustained by having undergraduates or their families pay rent and dues to the House Corporation, which in turn pays all of the annual operating costs, insurance, and house upkeep. In addition to income from student rent and dues, we have been fortunate to have some endowed funds which have served the chapter well and produced small annual scholarships that are granted to deserving or needy brothers. These scholarships pale in comparison to the financial need experienced by our young brothers, but they have helped us retain exceptional brothers who would otherwise have to leave the chapter, and possibly WVU, due to the costs.

This model has existed for decades, but it is no longer working. This campaign will establish a new and sustainable revenue model for the West Virginia Alpha House Corporation by enabling alumni to significantly offset the rising cost of education for our young brothers.

We will establish a \$1,250,000 Endowed Chapter Education Fund (OneFund) that will provide annual grants of roughly \$50,000 to the House Corporation. In this way, we enable alumni to create a permanently restricted asset that will benefit the chapter in perpetuity. The annual distributions from the West Virginia Alpha Chapter Education Fund will support three distinct functions:

- Offset the educational operating costs of running the chapter house on an annual basis.
- Award annual scholarships to our most deserving brothers.
- Provide funding for both national and local leadership development programs aimed at training our men to be better leaders.





## THE GENTLEMAN'S PARAGRAPH

# BROTHER JACK BOWMAN '58 REFLECTS

Over the years, as I have thought about my relationship with Phi Psi I keep returning to that magical moment when I discovered "The Gentlemen's Paragraph" in the pledge manual. I was studying for a pledge exam and had the book open to page 53, which showed a photo of the Memorial Chapel at West Virginia Alpha. My room, which I shared with Teddy Morlang from Parkersburg (long gone these many years) overlooked the chapel. I remember looking at the picture of the chapel, then looking at the chapel itself, then back to the picture for quite some time and thinking how fortunate I was to be in that very spot at that time.

Then I read the last paragraph on the preceding page, a paragraph we have come to call "The Gentleman's Paragraph."

"The whole sum of Phi Psi tradition may be gathered under the single word *gentleman*. It cannot be defined. It cannot be mistaken. A worthy member of Phi Kappa Psi is, and always must be, under all circumstances, in sickness or in health, in prosperity or in adversity, in the bosom of the chapter or the pitiless gaze of a cold world, a *gentleman*."

As corny as it must sound, after reading those words I wrote in the column opposite that paragraph, "Excellent! Live up to it!!" I still have the pledge manual with those contemporary notes on display in the bookshelf in my family room, because after sixty-two years this paragraph has continued to sum up what Phi Psi is about.

I was just shy of 20 when I was initiated. Now 62 years later, halfway through my 83rd year, I'm constantly reminded of this paragraph and what it meant. As I think of my fraternity brothers it is no exaggeration to say that they were, and are, *gentlemen*. Oh, we weren't perfect by a long shot. We were all involved in occasional episodes that represented the highlight of adolescent misbehavior.

For the most part, however, what I remember is the bond we formed and how it has actually grown stronger year after year. To repeat, my Phi Psi brothers WERE and ARE *gentlemen* – fair in their dealings with others, kind and ready to help one another. To this day I love "slipping the grip," putting those three dots after my name in communications with brothers and knowing that if I am in a group that contains some brothers, we will seek out each other and share a grip. I also know if I were to call on any number of my these brothers they would go far out of their way to aid me in any way they could, not because they owe me anything but because they know that we have shared that special bond in the Phi Kappa Psi chapel at WVU.

Fraternities are not merely for college boys out for a good time. They are instrumentalities that shape us and to a larger extent than many realize determine the kind of man we will ultimately become.
